
TOM NEWMAN

Fifty years after the release of his debut solo album, the Virgin Records co-founder releases his extraordinary memoirs.

Tom Newman's brutally honest life story begins with pre-school memories, through teenage dreams of being a rock star and ultimately to becoming best known as a talented music producer. Tom is a renowned English record producer and musician, most celebrated for his work on Mike Oldfield's groundbreaking *Tubular* Bells. Originally a guitarist in 1960s bands like The Tomcats and July, Newman shifted into music production after a fateful introduction to Richard Branson, going on to play a pivotal role in founding Virgin Records. His knack for capturing deeply emotive performances—despite having little formal technical training—became a defining hallmark of his production style.

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TOM NEWMAN

- John Wayne was a guest at Tom's wedding. Sophia Loren was due to attend, but had
 a last-minute filming clash.
- Tom was at the Beatles' final concert on the Apple building rooftop (photo, right)
- **Sir Tom Jones** was once fired by Tom Newman.
- Sir Richard Branson was persuaded by Tom to open a recording studio and start Virgin Records.
- Tom was the first person to see the potential in Mike Oldfield's *Tubular Bells* demo.
- "Without **Guinness**, there would be no *Tubular Bells*", says Tom, as it took a few pints of the black stuff to get Mike Oldfield to loosen up enough to share his ideas.
- Dave Gilmour used to play regular impromptu gigs with Tom at the Warwick Castle pub in Little Venice. Photo: Tom at home on the Isle of Wight with one of Dave Gilmour's guitars, July 2025.
- Tom recorded a single with the Great Train Robbers, although it was never released.
- Eric Idle, Peter Cook and Dudley Moore would often meet Tom for a pint and a chat.
- Sir Billy Connolly shared an entire Virgin flight to LA with Tom at the onboard bar.
- When working on Tubular Bells II in LA, Tom joined a private jam session with Jeff Lynne, Stuart Copeland and Mike Oldfield.
- Tom has owned and run many extremely unusual **recording studios**; on a canal boat, in a horsebox and on an ex-Navy minesweeper.
- The **Pirates for Peace** charity was setup by Tom to help Catholic and Protestant children in Northern Ireland collaborate on musical projects.
- His band **July's album** became one of the most sought-after collectible psychedelic pop records, with copies selling for thousands of pounds.
